

#### Youth unemployment

Unemployment in Poland is higher among the youth.

• It has risen to over 25% in 2011 and as of March 2014 is at 26.3%, and is higher than the OECD average of 16.3%.

 One of the consequences of unemployment being particularly high among the young has been a relatively high rate of youth emigration to other European countries, estimated in 2014 as 2 million (out of Poland's approximately 40 million population).



# The place of the women in the Active Life

- Women in the workforce :
  - →Employment rate for a women : 63%
  - → Employment rate for a men: 79%
- Women in the workforce (with a child older than 12 years old):
  - → Employment rate for a women : 66%
  - → Employment rate for a men : 90%
- Women and the part-time employment :
  - → 31% of working woman work in part-time
  - → 4 times higher than men
- Wage differences between men and women :
  - → To earn the same salary as a man, the woman should work an average of 59 days. With 16.2% on average, the pay gap between men and women remains high. It reflects the problem of balancing work and family life experienced by women. This gap is widening in some members country.





#### Rate of unemployment in Germany 2013




## RATE OF UNEMPLOYMENT ACCORDING TO AGE








### YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN GERMANY IN MARCH 2011 MARCH 2010







### TRAINING IN GERMANY AS AN EU MEMBER

Can EU citizens participate in training in Germany?

Yes, they can! Because of the principles of freedom of establishment and the freedom to provide services everybody can work in Germany and be given a training place offer. But you need appropriate grades and provide proof of language knowledge within the occupational area.



### How is the training process?

The training in Germany is dual. That means that you collect work experience for three years in a company and attend school simultaneously.

After the first and second year you have to pass an intermediate inspection, and after you have finished your third year the audit.

### How can I receive training?



Trainings are offered by the companies, so you have to apply directly to the company that you are interested in. You have to a apply one year ahead of schedule (mostly in September).

An employment agency helps you to apply.

Because of the economic situation in Germany there are more training positions than candidates.



#### RECOGNITION IN GERMANY

#### Conditions:

You need a provided, complete training that you didn't receive in Germany.

You may submit your application before going to Germany.

### **CONDITIONS**



 Between the age of 18-35, in connection with professional studies, an internship in Germany is only possible with the consent of the Federal Employment Agency



### **DURATION OF INTERNSHIP**

 Internships that are not considered as employment: three months within a period of twelve months, if more → apply for residence



### **VISA**

 Interns who need a visa for Germany also require a visa for the completion of the internship



### REMUNERATION

 Some companies pay 800 € per month, others nothing at all, but many pay between 300-500 €

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTS



 The following documents must be submitted to the ZAV (Zentralstelle für Arbeitsvermittlung):

Data collection sheet including internship plan, original matriculation certificate, information about the company



### **APPLICATION AND AGREEMENT**

 The employer applies at the ZAV-student reqruitment, and receives an agreement

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION


- The legal minimum wage of 8,50 € will be introduced on 1st January 2015
- With this new rule 3,7 million people will receive the legal minimum wage of 8,50 € per hour
- The legal minimum wage does not apply for teenagers under 18 years



### **EU MEMBER STATES**

- In 21 out of 28 EU member states there is a minimum wage
- In Luxembourg 10,83 €, followed by France, Belgium and the Netherlands with 9 €. Moreover, Spain with 3,91 €, Greece 3,35 €, Portugal 2,92 € and Poland 2,21 €. The worst situation is found in Bulgaria with 0,95 € and Romania 0,92 €






### Number of foreign citizens announced by employers (2005-2013)











Industries dealing with the export of graphene

Industries dealing with the renewable energy



#### Export of graphene.

Graphene is a very thin and almost transparent pure carbon. It is remarkably strong (100 times harder than the steel). It has a very low weight and it conducts heat and electricity with great efficiency.



#### Water treatments.

Water treatment is the industrial-scale process that makes water more acceptable for its final goal, which may be as for instance drinking water, industry, medical and many other uses.



#### E-commerce.

Electronic commerce draws on new technologies such as mobile commerce, electronic funds transfer, supply chain management, Internet marketing, online transaction processing, electronic data interchange (EDI), inventory management systems, and automated data collection systems.



### Renewable energy.

It is generally defined as the energy that comes from natural resources which are recovered on a human timescale such as sunlight, wind, rain, tides, waves and geothermal heat. Renewable energy replaces conventional fuels in four different areas, as for instance electricity generation, hot water/space heating, motor fuels, and rural (off-grid) energy services.








#### What is the Minimum wage?

The minimum amount of compensation an employee must receive for performing full time labour (40 hours per week).


According to the Spanish Real Decret the minimum wage in our country in 2014 is 8866,20€ per year which is 645,30€ per month and 21,51€ per day.






Euro per year (14 months)






Euro per month
